Statement of Need/Gap Analysis

The purpose of this CME activity is to address the identified gap(s):

1. There is lack of knowledge and competence in SUD treatment practice; SUD is not incorporated in office-based treatment of substance use disorders and so is underutilized across the Military Healthcare System MHS. Statistical data with MHA / DHA shows 95% of physicians have little or no familiarity with Buprenorphine as treatment for chronic pain and addiction.

Learning Objectives

1. Effectively treat, monitor, diagnose and manage SUD patients.
2. Effectively use Medication Assisted Therapy.
3. Effective implement the new DOD and NIDA initiatives, to include drug demand reduction and tobacco cessation.

Target Audience / Scope of Practice

Target Audience: This course is intended for physicians (primary, psychiatry, infectious disease, pain management, LCSW, counselors and other specialties) who are interested in pharmacotherapy or other modalities for substance use that can be undertaken in office-based settings.

Scope of Practice: This activity will increase the knowledge base, competencies and tools available to caregivers on office-based pharmacotherapy for substance use disorders. This course is most appropriate for primary care physicians because they are most likely to see cases of substance abuse first.
